Broken Hearts, Reactions of Children to Loss

Children experience loss in many ways. During this presentation types of childhood losses will be discussed. Children's reactions to loss and how we can support grieving children will be discussed. How we need to become more sensitive to age and cultural differences as well as how our own beliefs and values contribute to our support of children will also be included. Time for questions and discussion will be allotted at the end of the presentation. Presented by Sue Cooper, Certified Child Life Specialist & Crisis and Grief Consultant. *Sue Cooper is a child life specialist who worked at St Elizabeth Medical Center, Utica NY for twenty-six years providing support for children and families in medical crises. Sue has been working as a consultant for Oneida Madison Herkimer BOCES since 2009 providing school crisis education and support as well as individual support for staff and students.*
